From the President / CEO Nancy Wesson-Dodd

YWCA Corpus Christi has always sought to meet community needs as they changed, turning boulders into stepping stones along the way. “How to Survive and Thrive in an Ever-Changing World” guided YWCA plans and actions in 2021. Per experts’ advice, we masked for safety and health of participants, staff and community at large. We provided online fitness classes. Racial Justice Forum was held in person. Y Women in Careers was a hybrid presentation. We implemented remote learning for YWTeens to comply with schools, going to schools when permitted, interacting on line, making calls, sending emails, and holding drive-thru connections. The greatest unmet need we heard was for socialization and connectedness that coming together brings. Young and old are so hungry for connection!

YWCA sees a strong and viable future in carrying out our mission ELIMINATING RACISM EMPOWERING WOMEN. Toward that end, we upgraded our facility through prior years. Responding to declining fitness attendance and revenue and general predictions about evolving fitness trends and community demographics, the Board of Directors researched and took appropriate steps to assure long term stability and flexibility to respond to mission-related community needs. YWCA increased facility rentals, accepted an anonymous local entity’s offer to purchase the facility and lease it back to YWCA, adjusted operations to meet changing opportunities, and researched potential mission-related needs coming out of the pandemic. We continue to operate in a stable financial manner. We are committed to serving the community through the YWCA mission and programs.

2022 promises to be a year that YWCA reviews community needs to develop 2023-2025 Strategic Plan. 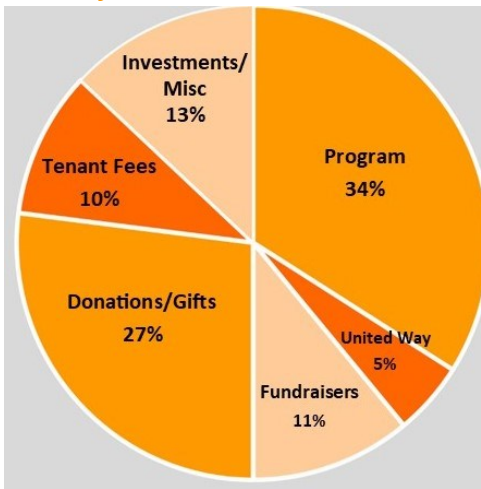

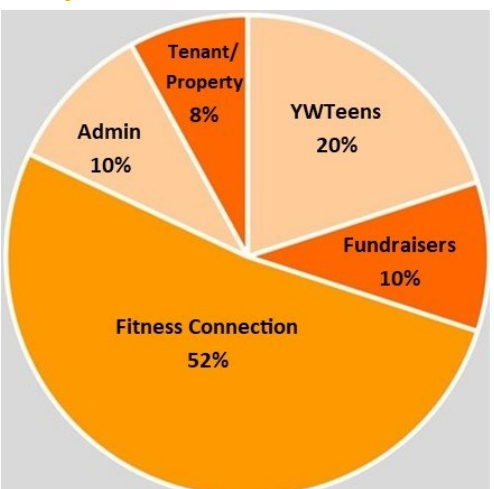
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YWCA *by the* NUMBERS 2021

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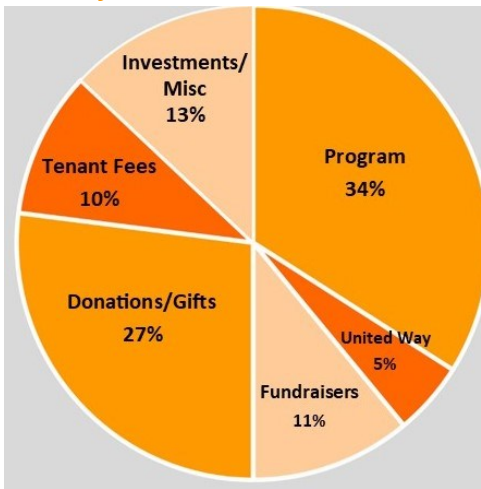
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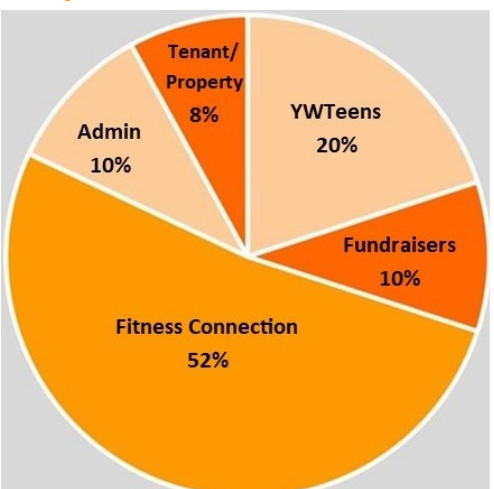
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
